GENERAL RULES

1. All exhibitors must be a member of Fettercairn Farmers Club.
2. All stock exhibited by any member must be the BONA FIDE property of the exhibitor. Pure-bred cows must have had a calf during the past 12 months.
3. All cups and trophies are to remain the property of the Club, unless otherwise stated.
4. Protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary before 1.30 p.m. on the day of the competition, accompanied by a deposit of £15 which will be forfeited in the event of the protest not being sustained.
5. The Management Committee reserves the right to alter or cancel any of the classes in the event of there being insufficient entries. All other rules and regulations are as stated in the Club Constitution which is subject to the interpretation of the Fettercairn Farmers Club Committee.
6. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards MUST be worn by all Riders. All PAS 015; VG1; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards.
7. **No animal can be entered or exhibited in more than one Class throughout the Cattle & Sheep Sections, except for Pairs, Groups etc.**
8. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that stock be kept under control at all times.
9. The transit of Animals (Cleansing and Disinfection) (Scotland) Order 2000 applies to vehicles taking animals to and from the Show. Please ensure that all vehicles, including haulier transportation, are thoroughly clean.

JUDGING

Horses & Ponies will commence at 08:30 prompt.

Cattle & Sheep will commence at 09:30 prompt after which time no livestock will be admitted.

* All prize-winning Cattle & Horses **must take part in the Grand Parade** unless exemption has been granted by the Fettercairn Show Committee or Government Restrictions prevent participation. No livestock to be removed from the Show Ground until after the Grand Parade.

* Judges are empowered to award prizes even where there is only one entry.

* Where more than one Judge is used to award a Special Prize or Championship, each Judge will decide which exhibits having already come before him/her, shall be brought forward.

Livestock

Scottish animals moving to Fettercairn Show for exhibition for the first time will not have to be kept separate prior to moving to the show irrespective of whether any other livestock have been moved onto those premises in the 13-day period immediately before moving. If attending only one show within any one 13-day period, the animal will not require to be held separate on return from the show nor will the return home trigger any a 13-day standstill for any other animal on the home farm. Also, animals may move from show to show or may return to their usual premise of residence without triggering a 13-day standstill provided they are kept in separate facilities under an authorised separation agreement with SGRPID.

CATTLE

1. All cattle for exhibition must comply with current SGRPID regulations.
2. All cattle must be led in the Judging Rings, unless otherwise stated.
3. Cattle must be ear tagged in accordance with SGRPID guidance.
4. Cattle moving to and from the Show must have their movements notified to ScotEID.
5. Fettercairn Show labels will be available on Show Day. Passports must be made available to Cattle Convener.

SHEEP

***Any sheep that is champion in its class cannot be entered into another class.**

Exhibitors should note that there is a section for Maedi-Visna Accredited sheep, and these sheep must be accompanied by proof of Accredited Status.

1. Pre-Show Requirements

Identification: Sheep must have official EID tagging (full EID for breeding sheep, single electronic tag for slaughter lambs).

Health & Biosecurity: Sheep must be disease-free and fit to travel

Movement Reporting: All movements to and from the show must be recorded on ScotEID using the Show field CPH number 80/466/8001

2. Post-Show Requirements

Movement Reporting: Record return to farm holding on ScotEID within 3 days.

Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

This year's show will be held at

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 17/18/19 October 2025

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and the website <https://puddledubshows.weebly.com/>

Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR)

The HCR series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

Qualifying shows are open to members and non-members.

In order to qualify for the HCR Championship Show at Netherton Equestrian, Perth on 6th/7th September 2025:

- HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)
- Non-members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge if placed 1st-4th(6th)), fees and register with HCR before the entries close for the HCR Championship show.

SPSBS AFFILIATION RULES 2024

1. **Classes must be confined to SPS_BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.**
2. **Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.**
3. **ONLY LICENCED STALLIONS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR ENTRY INTO STALLION CLASSES. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In-hand stallions 3 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.**
4. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. **Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over.** In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

- Only pure bred registered Highland youngster; foals, 1, 2 and 3yrs olds may enter.
- Two Championships will be held; one in Scotland (CSHPC Show at Strathallan Castle on 1st September 2024) and one in England (tbc). The qualifying exhibitor can select which Championship Show they wish to enter.
- Exhibitors are not required to be members of the Highland Pony Society for qualifying classes. However, all those competing in the Championships must be members of the Society.
- Entry to the Championships is free.
- At the Youngstock Championships, the Champions and Reserves will receive rosettes and prize money of £100 and £50 respectively and all those forward at the finals will receive £15 and a finalist rosette. A sash and perpetual trophy will be awarded to each of the Champions.
